Introducing Our "Holiday Pastor" — Dr. Karen E. Johnson



MWBC is blessed to welcome Dr. Karen Johnson to our ministry as a short-term Interim Pastor through the end of 2022. Pastor Karen is well known to the local ABC-Ohio community. From 2000-2010, she served as the Senior Pastor at Heritage Community Church in Price Hill, during which time she guided two small congregations as they merged into one healthy church that still thrives today. From 2010-2021, she was the Senior Pastor at Dorothy Lane American Baptist Church in Kettering. Karen received her doctorate in ministry from United Theological Seminary in 2016. Her studies focused on the small church in America and on encouraging those in small churches to continue doing God's work through new skills, education, and training. In addition, she has been invested in leading in local and regional work. Within ABC-Ohio at various times, she chaired the Ordination Committee, served on the Baptist Foundation, and led the Miami Baptist Association as moderator.

In August of 2021, Karen strongly felt God calling her away from her position at DLABC so that she could devote herself more deeply to her mother in South Carolina, who sadly passed away just a few weeks ago. Karen was able to spend

nearly half of her time in the past year with her mom. She currently resides in Dayton and

is a member of First Baptist Church of Dayton.


O Come, O Come, Emmanuel

They have a ministry in theological education in partnership with Sabah Theological Seminary in Kota Kinabalu, East Malaysia. When the pandemic struck, Aaron, Valerie, and their three children, Theophilus, Anastasia, and Azariah, were on what was supposed to be a brief visit to Singapore to secure their work passes/visas. Unable to return to Malaysia because of government lockdowns, they eventually came back to the US, where they have been residing ever since—and where their family grew by two more children, Micah and Josiah. During their two and a half years stateside. Aaron and Val were able to continue teaching virtually while building local missionary alliances—and while spending lots of time with grandparents Gary and Cindy Osterbrock.
