

Music Missions

Since we're in March now, for St. Patrick's Day, I searched for a hymn of Irish history, Irish melody, or Irish theme. The best I found is actually an amazing hymn we sing fairly often. The hymn "Be Thou My Vision" is the result of my search, and when reading the text and music attributed to this hymn, one reads that the words are an ancient Irish hymn and the music is an Irish folk melody. We don't know the actual author of the words, but the Irish hymn it is based on was from the seventh or eighth century.

The Irish church between AD 500 and AD 700 was known for its focus on mission works. In the book The Complete Book of Hymns there is a quote from a historian that explains the importance of mission work to the Irish at this time. The quote reads that their missionary fervor "was the one all-absorbing national thought and passion." What a wonderful statement to read and to remember these people! Their mission field was from Scotland to Switzerland. A missionary we do know by name was Columba from County Donegal, who was known as a poet of the Irish church and who loved to sing spiritual songs. This hymn we sing today is anonymous, but the truths and beauty of the words reach out to us all these centuries later. Throughout the song words expressing God are presented. He is my Vision, my Wisdom, my true Word; the words describing Him are capitalized, showing the importance and awesome nature of God. The song continues expressing our joy and hope that God's Grace gives us now and in the future when we reach heaven's joy! The world's riches and praises aren't important to us as things to seek; He is our inheritance and treasure. May He always be first in our hearts no matter what this world puts in our paths as stumbling blocks or negative influences since He is the Ruler of all

Thoughts from the Interim Pastor

Have you changed since the COVID epidemic started? It seems like the whole world has, for indeed the whole world was affected.

I remember the fear and the worry at the beginning of the whole thing. Would we all get it? Would so many people really die from it? With no firm knowledge of how it was spreading, we even wiped off our groceries when we got them home and wore double masks when we absolutely had to go out in public. Oh, there were the brave ones who kept some semblance of our daily lives going, from healthcare workers and firefighters to those who sanitized our buildings. We got daily updates from the state, with the death toll rising each day.

Early on, it was predicted that church attendance would be significantly decreased, both during and after the pandemic. And it is so. Statistically speaking, churches are seeing a third to a half of in-person attendance now as compared to pre-COVID days. It is so at Mt. Washington Baptist Church. I'm reluctant to point this out; I'd prefer to ignore the situation, but we cannot.

The level of fear from COVID has decreased significantly. When I caught COVID at the beginning of this year, I didn't fear for my life. I knew it just had to be endured, and that most cases are now much less destructive to one's health than so many early cases. Vaccines and proper precautions have helped to turn our fears into practical solutions. We feel better when we are able to do something constructive.

And that brings me to the point I most want to share. You should seriously consider coming back to church. I'm asking. Please come back to church! It is a constructive thing you can do. Sure, the church isn't perfect. It is composed of people who are looking to Jesus for strength and growth. Hopefully that describes you. Sure, you have to get up on Sunday morning and travel to church. Putting the worship of God at the forefront of life puts the rest of life in perspective.
