

#### Music

Many of us are familiar with the words to the hymn "Onward, Christian Soldiers." The words seem a bit fearsome — "Onward, Christian soldiers, marching as to war" — but the song was originally written as a children's song, sung as kids walked from village to village, coming together for a joyous school festival during Whitmonday in 1865. The idea was that the kids would march and sing this song. The words when you think on them aren't as fearsome as thought. They encourage the singer to follow Christ, united together against the powers opposed to the Christian faith. Written by Sabine Baring-Gould, the words were hastily put to paper in one evening. The composer was surprised, even thirty years later by how popular the song became and remained, given that he wrote it so quickly. I found the words that we don't sing interesting as we celebrate Memorial Day this month. They speak to the promises of Matthew 16:18 and Matthew 28:18-20 of the lasting of God's Church and Kingdom versus man's kingdoms. The words read: "Crowns and throne may perish, kingdoms rise and wane, but the Church of Jesus constant will remain. Gates of Hell can never 'gainst that Church prevail; we have Christ's own promise, and that cannot fail."

This month we remember those who gave our lives for our freedoms as a country and also the martyrs of the faith who died in defense of our religious freedom. Memories can be sad but also inspiring when we promise ourselves to continue to seek the goals of those who gave the ultimate sacrifice.

#### An Update on the Osterbrocks

Aaron and Valerie Osterbrock are Global Servants with ABCUSA's International Ministries, working on behalf of IM with seminary students in Sabah Theological Seminary in Kota Kinabalu, Malaysia. They are currently living in Hamilton, Ohio, where they are able to continue teaching students at STS virtually while also providing training within ABC Ohio's Leadership Academy. This semester, Aaron is teaching an OT/NT Survey course for students in Malaysia who have just graduated high school and are waiting for their test results to see what their next steps will be. The seminary developed a program years ago to help equip these students for ministry while they remain in limbo, awaiting their test scores.

Aaron is also preparing to attend Southern Seminary in the fall and is grateful for friends and supporters who prayed for him through the entrance exam and interview process. He writes, "I was thrilled to receive my acceptance letter to enroll in Southern's doctoral program in Biblical Theology, beginning this fall. Parts of this journey have left me amazed at the goodness of God, and [this] news was one of those



moments. Praise the Lord who gives us the desires of our hearts and then gives us the desires of our hearts (He gives us the desires and then He fulfills those desires)! What a gracious God we serve."

On May 12, Mother's Day, the Osterbrocks will be with us in worship, along with their six children: Theophilus, Anastasia, Azariah, Micah, Josiah, and baby Elijah. We look forward to hearing more about their ministry and future plans!
